Voice Of A New Generation



RAMY ESSAM

In 2011 Ramy Essam exploded into international fame as the real voice of the Egyptian revolution. His songs spread like wildfire among the demonstrators, and during the height of the uprising Ramy performed in front of millions of people in the Tahrir Square. The songs became the soundtrack of a whole generation of young Egyptians' struggle for a better future. His song Irhal, in which he's demanding the resignation of Mubarak, is referred to as the anthem of the revolution. Time Out Magazine later selected Irhal as the third most worldchanging song of all time (with John Lennon's Imagine #5 on the list).

But fame came at a heavy price with torture, arrests and censorship to silence Ramy. His songs were banned and he was unable to perform public shows. Still, he came out even stronger and more determined to speak out against the oppression. "In the revolution I was born again. The struggle became the purpose of my life." In 2014 he was offered a safe haven residency in Malmö, Sweden.

Once again having the chance to create and perform freely, he decided to use the opportunity to spread his message around the world. Today Ramy spends his time between Finland and Sweden.





In 2016 Ramy returned to the international scene big time, with a string of single releases that gained a lot of new audiences and attention. The single Segn Bel Alwan (featuring Lebanese rapper Malikah), highlighting women's situation and the issue of gender equality in his home country, became a big hit and one of the most streamed videos in Egypt in the weeks after its release. He has toured extensively internationally.

During 2016 and 2017 Ramy toured throughout Finland with the theatre

monologue *Ramy – In the Frontline*, which also gathered 5 stars reviews at the Fringe Festival Edinburgh.

Ramy remains to be one of the loudest voices for the young generation in Egypt and its struggle for a progressive and modern society, but has also become an international symbol of social activism and a beacon of uncommon bravery in the Middle East and the rest of the world.



In 2017, Ramy released his album Resala Ela Magles El Amn on Universal Music MENA.

The album consists of re-recorded older tracks and new compositions. And Essam remains as political as ever. The lyrical topics range from depictions of daily hardships of normal people, the struggle for social justice and women's rights, environmental issues and, of course, a big dose of criticism of the regime.

"Some of the songs were written while I was still in Egypt. But I feel very much that with what's

happening around the world today, the messages in the songs can be applied to many places in world. When talking about these issues with people from around the world, we can really connect in more or less similar experiences or situations." - Ramy Essam

The Egyptian Revolution has been an ongoing rollercoaster over the past two and a half years. Through the news, we only get a glimpse of the bloodiest battle, an election, or a million man march. At the beginning of July 2013, we witnessed the second president deposed within the space of three years.

The Square is an immersive experience, transporting the viewer deeply into the intense emotional drama and personal stories behind the news. It is the inspirational story of young people claiming their rights, struggling through multiple forces, in the fight to create a society of conscience.




